# From the West



### Greetings!

I attended the Master's Charge at Grand Lodge on Saturday, March

31st. This one -day class is designed to educate sitting Senior Wardens so that they have better expectations...and plans...for when / if they stand for Master the following year. In attendance were a number of other Senior Wardens and other line officers from lodges around Oregon.

While the morning involved sessions taught by various Grand Lodge officers, there was also a "round robin" group session. During that, it became evident to me that, based on my "membership topics" in our Trestleboard the last few months, Bend Lodge is not the only lodge in Oregon suffering the effects of declining member participation. There were a number of reasons that we talked about, but one of the key aspects seemed to revolve around what we ended up calling, as a group, the "sameo, sameo" effect.

A number of lodges have polled past members who simply stopped coming to lodge meetings and events. One of the more common comments made by some of these absentee brothers was that lodge just become "too routine...it's the SAME, exact thing at each and every meeting! Open the meeting...read the minutes...talk about what we as a lodge have done (or NOT done, in more than a few cases!) in our local community... adjourn, visit refreshment...and go home". The "fun factor" seemed to be missing and more than a few hinted that coming to lodge had, simply, "Become a chore instead of something to look forward to".

Some older brothers were hesitant to drive after dark, when many lodges have their meetings. Still others commented about what with monthly Stated Meetings, degree work, whatever charitable work their lodge was doing in the community, or participation in other aspects of Masonry other than the local blue lodge, Masonry had become almost like a full-time job!

Other members had a change in employment or family obligations...totally understandable that folks sometimes have to reprioritize their lives based on work and family issues. Others indicated that their personal philosophies had changed.. that perhaps what drew them to Masonry in the first place no longer met their needs or expectations or were relevant in their current lives.

Finally, some of those brothers who might have been absent for any length of time were actually ... **embarrassed**...about possibly returning! "What if I can't remember what to do?! I can't remember the penal sign or the order of things or some other aspect of attending lodge..."

I think we all agreed that most of these types of things are fixable! What it comes down to is finding out what the issues are...not from the officers' line guessing at them...but by going direct to the source...the missing members!

To that end, we're going to try something. By the end of this month, by either email (or by "snail mail" for those brothers who don't "do tech"), you, the members of Bend Lodge, will be receiving a survey. We ask that you take a few minutes, look it over, fill it out and send it back. There will be some suggested issues that you can check off, but also room for you to personalize your answers, and tell us what YOU think.

What is even more disturbing is that there were no signs of a forced entry.

The chair is replaceable and thankfully the crime was only theft, this time! Over the next few weeks, you will be seeing a "hardening" of our Masonic Center in two ways. First, to create a structurally-sound defense against person(s) attempting to unlawfully gain entry. This will be in the form of increased security for the doors and windows.
