Hard to believe that we're into May already...where DOES

the time go???

By now, those Bend Lodge members who live in Central Oregon should have received their surveys in the mail. If, for some reason, you didn't, or if you would like to participate in the survey, just let me know and I will either email or snail mail a copy to you...

I heartily encourage you to take a few minutes and go through it...since there is no place to put your name on the survey (unless you feel so inclined), we want you to feel like you can give us your honest opinion in several areas...WHY have some members gone missing, and WHAT can we do to not only entice those missing folks back, but make Bend Lodge a place that Masons look forward to attending. Heck, we even included a self-addressed stamped envelope to send your completed survey back! Please try and do so by no later than May 15th.

As mentioned by WM Alexander, we've been working with Redmond and Prineville lodges to get some degree work done. It's important to be "several people deep" in some of the various parts, depending on the degree, so that if one person isn't available on a specific date, we have a backup.

Think back to when you went through your own degrees... did you see supporters on the sidelines, or just the primary officers participating in the actual degree?

Junior Warden Brasher mentioned that there has been some much-needed work and improvements going on at Bend Lodge, and we think you will be pleased:

- The parking spaces have been repainted and directional areas put in for ingress/egress;
- A new, lockable (when needed), permanently-mounted security gate now limits access to upstairs;
- By the time you attend our next Stated Meeting, we should have a new phone system and WIFI in the building. The latter should be a great selling point for those looking to rent the downstairs area of the lodge for meetings, etc. The lodge phone number, 541-389-7407, will remain the same, but now we have a way to be notified and remotely access any voice mails that are left on the recorder. Although the base phone set will probably remain in the upstairs office, there will be two portable units elsewhere around the lodge;
- New metal double doors with a removable center post have been received for the NE corner of the upstairs lodge room. Besides being much more secure than the wood doors they will replace, once installed, they should also be much more energy efficient;
- We now have an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) that has been mounted at the bottom of the first landing so that it is easily accessible both upstairs and down. (We'll be having some training as to its use in the near future...).

We still have a number of other improvements yet to be completed. Hopefully, those can be done in the near future. ('SECRETARY'S DESK', continued from Pg. 1)

 This will require some coordination with Bend Public
 Works and possibly a lodge work day for some good old-fashioned manual labor;
- Purchasing and installation of some sort of security camera system for monitoring both the inside and the outside of the lodge.
